Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Julia Anne Becker of the city of Baltimore, from her husband John H. Becker, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third

time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to divorce Lucy O'Brien of Montgomery county, from her husband William O'Brien, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to.

After the word 'O'Brien' in the 3d line, strike out the residue of the section and insert 'a mensa et thoro.'

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The bill entitled, an act to require the chancery court and the several county courts as courts of equity, in this State, to demand bond with surety in cases of injunction, was read the third time by special order and passed.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The said bill was reconsidered and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act for making certain roads in Baltimore and Harford counties, was being read the second time; when

On motion of Mr. Brown,

It was ordered to lie on the table.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act enitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore and Ohio rail

road company, and

The bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Canton Company of Baltimore, were severally read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kent from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act to appoint commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Savage village in Anne Arundel county.

Which was read the first time.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
