

TUESDAY, March 7, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Daniel Waters of Harford county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to provide for the inspection and weight of anthracite or hard coal, and for the measurement of bituminous coal, and

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of George Fouke and Elizabeth his wife, and Henry and Louis Fouke, were severally read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to repeal the second section of an act entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act concerning the amendment of judicial proceedings, passed at December session, 1833, chapter 274, was read the third time, when

Mr. Tidball moved to amend said bill by striking out the proviso.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The bill and amendment were ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Ricaud from the committee on internal improvement to which was referred the memorial of Amon Bosley and others, and the counter memorials of Thomas D. Cockey and others, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise the owner or owners of any mill, factory, distillery, quarry or lime kiln situated within the distance of five hundred yards from any rail road now made or which may hereafter be constructed, to apply to the county court, the levy court or to the commissioners of the county, as the case may be, to lay out and open a private road or way from such mill, factory, distillery, quarry or kiln, to the most convenient place for intersecting such rail road,

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough,

The bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower Elizabeth Duvall, executrix of Grafton B. Duvall of Anne Arundel county, to sell and dispose of her negro man
