William Philips, who is a slave only for a term of years, beyond the limits of this State, was reconsidered.

The said bill was then read, rejected and returned to

the house of delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution in favor of the securities of Samuel Warnick,

Which was read the first and by special order the second and third time, assented to and returned to the house of delegates.

Also the following resolutions:

A resolution authorizing Capt. Henry J. McKinnel to take possession of certain pieces of artillery,

Which was read the first time and referred to the com-

mittee on the militia.

A resolution relating to a fire proof magazine,

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on the militia.
