

On motion of Mr. Goldsborough,

It was ordered that the memorial of John Thomas and others, citizens of Baltimore, relating to the rates of charges for hackney coach hire in said city, now on the files of the senate, be referred to Messrs. Goldsborough, Jones and Tidball, with power to report by bill or otherwise.

Mr. Cottman from the committee to which was referred the petition of sundry citizens of Carroll county, reported a bill entitled, an act to establish a line between Carroll and Baltimore counties,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading:

Mr. Ricaud from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Kendall S. Cropper, of the city of Philadelphia, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed at December session 1809, chapter 138, was read the third time, passed as heretofore proposed to be amended, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Wright from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Thomas Goulden,

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Tidball,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Ricaud,

The Senate proceeded to consider the amendments to the bill entitled, an act to regulate the manner of taking testimony in cases of equity.

The question was put,

“Will the Senate assent to the amendment proposed by the house of delegates, to the first amendment of the senate?”

And it was determined in the affirmative.
