

sustained by any person or persons whose lands may be affected by such survey and condemnation, and the damages so assessed, together with all the necessary expenses incurred for survey, laying out, and condemning said lot of ground, shall be returned by said commissioners to the levy court of Worcester county, to be by them levied and assessed on the assessable property of said county."
