Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Brown, Tidball and Jones.

A bill entitled, an act in relation to the driving of cat-

tle and sheep through Kent county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wright, Goldsborough and Hambleton.

A bill entitled, an act to widen part of Wagon alley in

the city of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Jones, Brown and Kent.

A bill entitled, an act for the better regulation of School districts in the upper election district of Caroline county, so far as relates to the School district No. 3,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Goldsborough, Wright and Cottman.

And returned the bill, which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act to authorise Fayette street in the Town of Rockville in Montgomery county, to be closed, and another to be called by the same name to be opened, endorsed 'will pass.'

Mr. Kent from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to ascertain the allowance of the sheriff of Anne Arundel county for keeping prisoners in jail, and to provide for the maintenance of debtors actual-

ly confined in prison, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third

time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the petitions of sundry eitizens of Baltimore county, reported a bill entitled, an act to abolish the board of commissioners for Baltimore county, and vest their powers and duties in a Levy court,

Which was read the first and by special order, the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Brown,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent

to the house of delegates.

Mr. Kent from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Charles Boone late collector of the second collection district of Anne Arundel county, reported favorably thereon.
