It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Brown,

The bill entitled, an act to authorise the owner or owsiers of any mill, factory, distillery, quarry or lime kiln ntuated within the distance of five hundred yards from any rail road now made or which may hereafter be constructed, to apply to the county court, the levy court or to the commissioners of the county, as the case may be, to lay out and open a private road or way from such mill, factory, distillery, quarry or kiln, to the most convenient place for intersecting such rail road, was read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Brown from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act relating to the election districts in

Baltimore county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third

time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Hilleary from the committee on revolutionary claims to which was referred the resolution in favor of Winfred Allen, and

The resolution in favor of Benedict Reynolds, reported that the committee had had said resolutions under consideration and were of opinion they ought not to be assent-

ed to.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, dissented from and returned to the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the fol-

lowing message.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We respectfully ask the return of a bill entitled, an act relating to the land warrants granted to revolutionary soldiers or to persons claiming under them, passed this house on the 7th inst.
