Mr. Goldsborough from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the better regulation of the School districts of Caroline county, so far as relates to the School district No. 3, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act relating to Uhler's alley in the city of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.
