

make a report to this Legislature, setting forth the amount received under the aforesaid act of Congress, or to be received, the nature of the payment made to him; whether he has received treasury warrant, or checks or drafts, in payment of that portion of the surplus revenue to be deposited with the State of Maryland by said act, or any, and if any, what portion thereof, and if in Treasury warrants, in checks or drafts; upon what Bank or Banks they are drawn and the amount on each, with such suggestions as he may think proper to make in regard to the future disposition of said funds: Provided always, and be it enacted, that the said Treasurer shall make no use whatever of the said Treasury warrants, or checks or drafts, but shall deposit them in the Farmers Bank of Maryland, for safe keeping, subject to the future control and disposition of this General Assembly."

The bill was then read through the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

The President laid before the Senate a communication from the Treasury of the Western Shore, made in obedience to the Act of Assembly of December session, 1824, chapter 125.

Which was read and referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution in favor of the Electors of President and Vice President, Electors of the Senate and certain members of the present and late Senate.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

Mr. Schley appeared in the Senate Chamber and took his seat.

The appointed hour having arrived, the Senate proceeded to the election of United States Senator. The ballot box was prepared, and the ballots deposited therein. It was then sealed up and delivered to Messrs. Ricaud and Brown, who were appointed conjointly with a committee of the House of Delegates to count the ballots and report the result. They accordingly retired, and after a time returned and reported that they had discharged the duty assigned them, and had found there were 79 votes
