The amendments proposed by the house of delegates to the bill entitled, an act to regulate the right of voting by the Stockholders in the several incorporated institutions in this State, were taken up for consideration, read and assented to.

Mr. Schley presented the petition of J. M. Selden, to bring certain slaves into this State,

Which was read and referred to the committee on colored population.

On motion of Mr. Jones,

The bill entitled, an act to widen part of Wagon alley in the city of Baltimore, was read the third time by special order, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, March 15th, 1837.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

On motion of Mr. Hilleary,

Leave was granted him to withdraw the preamble and resolution offered by him on yesterday, in favor of Charles Howel.

Mr. Schley presented the petition of sundry citizens of Carroll county, formerly of Liberty and New Market districts in Frederick county, for an alteration in the divisional line between said counties,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Schley, Brown and Wright.

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the protection of Oysters in the waters of the Eastern Shore of this State, passed at December session 1831, chapter 249, so far as relates to the waters bordering on Queen Anne's county, was read the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
