A bill entitled a supplement to an act entitled an act, to provide for the public printing of the State, passed at December session 1831, chapter 383;

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Schley, Wright and Goldsborough.

A bill entitled an act to provide for the purchase of certain papers for the use of the surveyor's office of Montgomery county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Cottman, Tidball and Kent.

A bill entitled a supplement to the act, to provide for the building a bridge across Laws thoroughfare in Somerset county, passed at December session 1834, chapter 26,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Cottman, Purnell and Hambleton.

A bill entitled an act to provide for building a bridge over Dividing creek at a place called Denston's dams, on the public road leading from Princes Ann in Somerset county to Snow Hill in Worcester county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Purnell, Cottman and Goldsborough.

A bill entitled an act relating to the German reformed parsonage in the town of Hagerstown Washington county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Tidball, Schley and Hilleary.
