

mittee were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

Sec. 2, And be it enacted, That the voters residing in that part of Carroll county which lies within the said 3d Congressional district, shall vote for a member of Congress for said 3d Congressional district; and that the voters residing in that part of Carroll county which lies within the said 5th Congressional district, shall vote for a member of Congress for said 5th Congressional district, at the same time and places and before the same judges of elections respectively, at which, and before whom they vote for delegates to the General Assembly of Maryland.

Sec. 3, And be it enacted, That in all cases where a portion of the said 3d Congressional district, and a portion of the said 5th Congressional district shall be contained in one election district in Carroll county, the judges of election of said district shall keep a separate box in which the ballots of the voters of the 3d Congressional district shall be deposited, and also a separate box in which the ballots of the voters of the fifth Congressional district shall be deposited, and that the poll be kept open and that all other formalities and requisitions be complied with as regards said elections, that are now required by law in the election of Representatives in the Congress of the United States from this State.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act further to continue an act passed at November session 1894, entitled, an act to incorporate the Chesapeake Insurance Company, and

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to provide for the appointment of collectors of the county tax in and for the city and county of Baltimore, passed at December session 1823, reported favorably thereon.

They were severally read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Cottman from the committee on finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Hagerstown Bank, reported favorably thereon.
