And returned the following bills which originated in the Senate, severally endorsed "will pass."

The bill entitled an act for the relief of Thomas Goul-

den,

The bill entitled an act to regulate the charges for the use of hackney carriages in the city of Baltimore, and,

The bill entitled an act to authorise Noble Pennington, late sheriff of Cecil county, to amend his return in a certain case therein mentioned.

Also returned the following bills which originated in

the senate, severally endorsed "will not pass."

The bill entitled a supplement to an act entitled an act, to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of the Washington bank, at the town of Williamsport in Washington county, passed at December session 1831, chapter 133, and

The bill entitled an act to appoint commissioners for the regulation and improvement of Savage village in An-

ne-Arundel county.
