Gentlemen of the Senate,

We propose with the concurrence of your honorable body, the appointment of a joint committee of three members of the Senate and three members of the House of Delegates, to enquire into the practicability, probable cost and expediency of warming the Senate Chamber, the Hall of the House of Delegates, and the offices attached to them respectively, the Council Chamber, and all other apartments of the State House occupied and used for public purposes, or any one or more of them, by means of heated air, introduced by flues, or by any other mode which shall promote the comfort of the members of the Legislature, and the other members and officers of government, and shall be calculated to lessen the annual cost of fuel to the state; and that said committee have leave to report by bill or otherwise. We have appointed Messrs. Dawson, Iglehart and Hicks, the committee on the part of this house.
