By a joint resolution, passed at December session 1832, No. 41, it was resolved, "that at every meeting of the General Assembly, a joint committee shall be appointed to investigate and report to the General Assembly, the proceedings of the Board of Visitors and Governors of St. John's College, and whether the same be in conformity to law, and calculated to effectuate the design of the Legislature in endowing said College."
