

also, that if the debts of the said company shall at any time exceed the whole amount of cash capital subscribed, to the stock of said company, the directors, for the time being, shall become personally liable, for the payment of such excess."

Mr. Hambleton from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to divorce Elizabeth Gibson of the city of Baltimore, from her husband John Gibson, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Jones from the committee on corporations and joint stock companies, to which was referred the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Georges Creek Mining Company, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which the committee had directed him to report as a substitute for the amendment heretofore reported.

At the end of the bill add:

"And provided also, that a cash capital of thirty thousand dollars at least, shall be actually subscribed and paid in, before the company incorporated by the provisions of the aforesaid act shall go into operation,—which said part of the capital stock when so paid in, shall be certified in writing by such persons as the Treasurer of the Western Shore shall appoint to ascertain and report said fact to said Treasurer; and provided also, that if the debts of the said company shall at any time exceed the whole amount of cash capital subscribed to the stock of said company, the directors for the time being, shall become personally liable for the payment of such excess."

On motion of Mr. Hilleary,

The amendment heretofore reported was withdrawn.

The question was then put on the adoption of the amendment last reported, and determined in the affirmative.

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.
