SATURDAY, January 14, 1837.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolutions relative to employing additional counsel to aid the attorney general in a certain suit therein mentioned,

Was sent to the Senate.

The Speaker announced the following message as having been received from the Senate on yesterday, viz:

The resolution in favor of Patience Fitzgerald, endorsed, "dissented from,"

And delivered a bill originated in and passed by the Senate, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Neptune Insurance company;

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

The Speaker laid before the House a report from Richard H. Hall, Esq., one of the State tobacco inspectors, showing the amount of money paid by him into the Western Shore treasury within the year ending on the 30th of November;

Which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. McLean presented a memorial of William Frick and George Frick, praying that a certain deed of mortgage therein mentioned may be made valid—and

Mr. Matthews presented a petition of Thomas Jones, of Charles county, praying to be permitted to sell a certain tract of land therein mentioned;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Brengle presented a petition of Valentine Brunner, a soldier of the revolution, praying to be placed on the pension roll;

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Tuck presented a petition of sundry citizens of Prince George's county, asking the passage of a law to increase the fees of the crier of Prince George's county court;
