The committee on the colored population, to whom was referred a bill, entitled, an act to enable William Wilson, of Wm, of Harford county, to manumit and set free a negro man therein named, have had the same under consideration, and report that it is competent for the said William Wilson, of Wm., to manumit the said negro under the provisions of the act of 1832, chapter 296, sec. 4, as soon as his term of service shall have expired. They therefore consider any legislation on this subject unnecessary, and pray that they may be discharged from its further consideration, and that the petitioner have leave to withdraw his petition.
