Sec. 3d. And be it enacted, that nothing in this act shall be construed to affect the legitimacy of the children of the said parties, during their marriage, nor to prevent them from inheriting from either their father or mother, or from each other, in the same manner as before the passage of this act;

Determined in the negative.
