On motion of Mr. Keene, the House resolved to proceed with the ordinary business of the session during the absence of the doorkeeper;

The bill reported by Mr. Buchanan, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from such point as the Somerset and Cumberland turnpike company of Pennsylvania, shall fix upon at the Pennsylvania line to the public Square in the town of Cumberland, or to intersect the United States road, commonly called the National road, at such point as may be most convenient and practicable, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

The door-keeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the order of the day, being the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act entitled, an act for the division of Baltimore and Frederick counties, and for erecting a new one of the name of "Carroll," and to alter and change the constitution of this State so far as may be necessary to affect the same, passed at December session 1835, chapter 256;

The question was then put, shall the said bill pass?

Resolved in the affirmative.
