

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the relief of William Hughes, of Anne Arundel county;

And the bill entitled, an act to alter and change the divisional line between the third and fourth districts of Anne Arundel county;

Severally endorsed "will pass," and severally ordered to be engrossed;

Also, the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act to incorporate the George's Creek Mining Company; endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;"

Which amendment was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table;

And delivered the following message;

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

By a joint resolution, passed December session 1832, No. 41,) it was resolved, "that at every meeting of the General Assembly, a joint committee shall be appointed to investigate and report to the General Assembly the proceedings of the Board of Visitors and Governors of St. John's College, and whether the same be in conformity to law, and calculated to effectuate the design of the Legislature in endowing said College." In pursuance of this resolution, we have appointed Messrs. Schley and Kent on the part of the Senate, to join such gentlemen as may be named by your honorable body.
