MONDAY, January 16th, 1837.

The house met. Present the same members as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Michael Swingley, esq , a delegate returned for Wash-

ington county, appeared qualified and took his seat.

Messrs. Donoho and Pierson, who have been confined by indisposition, again appeared in the house and resumed their seats.

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Ann Sears, of

Calvert county, from her husband Robert Sears;

Green, of Montgomery county;

Also, the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from such point as the Somerset and Cumberland Turnpike Company of Pennsylvania shall fix upon at the Pennsylvania line, to the Public Square in the town of Cumberland, or to intersect the United States road, commonly called the National road, at such point as may be most convenient and practicable;

And, the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act entitled, an act for the dividing of Baltimore and Frederick counties, and for erecting a new one by the name of "Carroll," and to alter and change the constitution of this State so far as may be necessary to affect the same, passed at December

session 1835, ch. 256;

Were sent to the Senate.

By the House of Delegates, January 16th, 1837.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message proposing the appointment of a joint committee in conformity with resolution No. 41, of 1832, to investigate and report to the General Assembly the proceedings of the Governors and Visiters of St. John's College, and to inquire whether they are in conformity to law, and the design of the Legislature in endowing them, and concur therein.

Pursuant to said resolution, we have appointed Messrs. Ridgely, Crisfield and Ghiselin on the part of the house

to join the gentlemen of your honorable body.
