TUESDAY, January 17, 1837.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, an act declaratory of the law concerning contempts of court in this State;

Also, the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Patapsco Bank of Maryland;

Also, the resolutions in favor of Ann Wright and James W. Fling, Executor of James Fling,

Were sent to the Senate.

The bill from the Senate, entitled, an act to authorise the Franklin Rail Road company, incorporated by the State of Pennsylvania, to extend their works within the limits of the State of Maryland,

Also, the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act, entitled, an act to alter and amend the constitution and form of government, so as to require the assent of two-thirds of each branch of the legislature to annul a marriage contract,

Were returned to the Senate.

The Speaker laid before the house a report from the clerk of Prince George's county court, relative to the attendance of judges;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Mann presented a petition of James Welsh and others, trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Clearspring, in Washington county, praying for an act to authorise said trustees to sell a certain lot of land therein mentioned;
