Mr. Buchanan obtained leave to bring in a bill, to confirm an act passed at December session, 1835, chapter 44, entitled, an act to amend the constitution and form of government, so far as relates to the division of Allegany county into election districts, and to establish an election district;

Ordered, that Messrs. Buchanan, Smith and Bruce, report the same.

Ordered, that the bill, entitled, an act to incorporate the Union Bank of Allegany, referred by the preceding to the succeeding session, be referred to the committee on ways and means.

On motion of Mr. Ely,

Ordered, that the bill, entitled, an act relating to slaves, referred by the preceding to the succeeding session, be referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Brengle reported a bill, entitled, an act to confirm an act, entitled, an act for the division of Baltimore and Frederick counties, and for erecting a new one by the name of Carroll, and to alter and change the constitution of this State, so far as may be necessary to effect the same, passed at December session, 1835, chapter 256,
