

The bill reported by Mr. Rentch, entitled, an act to incorporate the Williamsport Manufacturing company, and the amendments reported thereto from the committee on corporations,

Said bill was referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

The door keeper having returned, reported that in obedience to order, he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the order of the day, being the bill reported by Mr. Ridgely, entitled, an act supplemental to an act, entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs of Jane White, late of the city of Baltimore;
