On motion of Mr. Richardson,

Said bill was amended, by inserting, as the 4th section thereof, the following—

Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of said commissioners, before proceeding to act under the provisions of this bill, or the act to which it is a supplement, to give notice, in the daily papers of the city of Baltimore, for at least one week, of the time and place at which they will meet, notifying all persons interested to attend, with their vouchers, &c., at such time and place as shall be designated by the commissioners aforesaid.

Mr. Richardson moved further to amend said bill, by adding at the end thereof, as an additional section, the following—

Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of said commissioners to return, as soon as their award shall be made, a schedule of the items for which indemnity shall have been granted, specifying the same particularly, and the testimony upon which the award has been made;

Which was read.

Mr. Harris moved to lay the bill and amendment on the table;
