

Mr. Culbreth obtained leave to bring in a bill to provide for the safe keeping of the State house and other public property in the city of Annapolis;

Ordered, That Messrs. Culbreth, Alexander and Ridgely report the same.

Mr. Bowlus obtained leave to bring in a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish magistrates courts in the several counties of this State, and to prescribe their jurisdiction;

Ordered, That Messrs. Bowlus, Harding, Carpenter Hicks and Crisfield report the same.

Mr. McDaniel submitted the following resolution—

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the committee on public printing be instructed, in making their contract for the publication of the laws which may be passed at the present session, to insert a provision compelling the publication and delivery of said laws within sixty days after the termination of the session;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time;

On motion of Mr. Buchanan,

Said resolution was ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Donoho, from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs of Samuel Polk, of Somerset county, reported the same without amendment;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time, by special order, passed, and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Gough, from the committee to which was re-committed the bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act authorising persons holding real estate, in fee simple, to construct wharves on any of the navigable waters of this State, passed at December session, 1835, chapter 68; reported said bill;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Shower reported a bill, entitled, an act concerning rail roads in Baltimore county;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Smith reported a bill, entitled, an act to settle and adjust a part of the western boundary line between this State and the State of Virginia—and
