Delivered the annual report of the trustees of the Franklin academy in Baltimore county, endorsed "referred to

the consideration of the house of delegates;"

Which was read and referred to the committee on edu-

Also, a letter from John McKenney, Esq., accepting of his appointment as a member of the Executive Council;

Which was read,

On motion of Mr. Eccleston,
