A bill, entitled, an act to authorise and direct the levy court of Frederick county to levy a sum of money for the enlargement and repair of the court house in said county,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Bowlus, Brengle

and Matthias,

And a bill, entitled, an act to divorce Frances A. Stockwell from her husband, John Stockwell;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on di-

vorces.

On motion of Mr. Powell,

The House adjourned until to morrow morning ten o' clock.

TUESDAY, January 24, 1837.

The House met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution in relation to authorising the joint committee on the Library, to procure from London, the several books recommended by the Librarian, for the use of the Li-

brary,
Was sent to the senate.

Mr. Mann, obtained leave to bring in a bill, to establish a ferry, across the Potomac river at Hancock in Washington county.

Ordered, That Messrs. Mann, Swingley, and Kershner,

report the same.

Mr. Mann, also obtained leave to bring in a bill, to incorporate the town of Clear Spring, and its addition in Washington county,

Ordered, that Messrs. Mann, Kershner and Rentch, re-

port the same.

Mr. Maulsby, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to which was referred the bill, reported by Mr. Boyd, entitled, an act to make valid the instrument of writing therein mentioned, reported the same without amendment;

Which was read the first and by special order the se-

cond time, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Carpinter, chairman of the committee on divorces, made a favourable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to divorce Frances A. Stockwell, from her husband John Stockwell;
