Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to James Vane, one of the legal representatives of Lucretia Vane, or to his order, nine dollars and seventy-seven cents, being for two months' and twenty-eight days' pension due to said Lucretia at the time of her death, to wit, on the 28th September, 1835;
