

shall be given to the person or persons, interested in the lands, about to be condemned by personal service of such notice, on him or them, or by leaving such notice at his or their place of abode, or by inserting the same for three successive weeks, in some newspaper published in Cumberland;—and

On motion of Mr. Buchanan, said bill was further amended by adding at the end of the 6th section thereof, the following, "or any other tenement, or orchard or garden,"

Also, by striking out in the sixth line the word "seven," and inserting "five," and in same line striking out "eighteen," and inserting "twenty-one," and in seventh line same section striking out "twelve," and inserting "eighteen,"

The said bill having been read through as amended,

The question was put, shall the said bill pass,  
Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. McLean, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Richardson, entitled, an act to incorporate the Calvert Beneficial Society,

The amendments reported to said bill from the committee on corporations, having been read the second time, were severally assented to,

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Carpinter,

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

THURSDAY, January 26th, 1837.
