Mr. Tuck, chairman of the committee on coloured population, reported a bill entitled, an act to authorise and empower Elizabeth Duvall, executrix of Grafton B. Duvall, of Anne Arundel county, to sell and dispose of her negro man William Phillips, who is a slave only for a term of years, beyond the limits of this State;

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Bowlus, chairman of the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, an act to authorize the confirmation of the return of the commissioners in a certain case of proceedings under the act to direct descents in Frederick county, reported the same without amendment.

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table;
