Was taken up for consideration, read the second time,

and rejected.

Mr. Brengle, chairman of the committee on internal improvement, reported a bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Delaware and Maryland Rail Road company,

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Brengle moved to give said bill a second reading, by special order.

Mr. Tuck moved that the house adjourn,

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put upon the motion of Mr. Brengle, Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Tuck, the house was called, and the door-keeper sent for the absent members, who, after a short time had elapsed, returned and reported that he had notified the absent members that their attendance in the house was required.

The house then resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Delaware and Maryland Rail Road company.

Mr. Carpinter moved to lay said bill on the table,

Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Keene moved that the house adjourn,

Determined in the negative
