the words "Hepsley's Ford," insert "as the commissioners in their judgment may determine."

On motion of Mr. Ridgely, said bill was further amended by adding at the end of first section, the following proviso.

Provided, that this act shall have no effect, unless the propredors, residents of Anne Arundel county, through whose land the said road is to be laid out, give their assent in writing, first to be filed with the respective commissioners of each county,

The said bill was then read the second time as amended,

and passed.

On motion of Mr. Smith,

The house adjourned until Monday morning ton o'clock.
