Mr. Buchanan presented a petition of sundry citizens of Allegany county, praying the incorporation of a bank, to be called the Union Bank of Allegany;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways

and Means.

Mr. Coombes presented a petition of sundry citizens of district No. 6, in Prince George's county, praying to have the present place of holding elections for said district made to a more convenient situation;

Which was read and referred to Messrs Coombes, Tuck

and Ghiselin.

And, Mr. Kerr presented a memorial of T. C. Nicols, praying the passage of a law fixing an annual compensation to the clerk of the commissioners for Talbot county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Kerr, Boyle and

Townsend, of Talbot.

Mr. Ely obtained leave to bring in a bill entitled, an act to amend an act entitled, an act to release the right of the State to a part of a tract of land therein mentioned, passed at December session 1810, chap. 8.

Ordered, That Messr. Ely, Worthington and Risteau

report the same.

Mr. McLean, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill entitled, an act relating to

mortgages in the city of Baltimore; and,

Mr. Hicks reported a bill entitled, an act supplemental to an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons;

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to

lie on the table.

Mr. Richardson, chairman of the committee on lotteries, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled, a supplement to an act authorising Henry Shafer, George Shafer, and Henry J. Shafer, to distribute their estate by lot, passed at December session 1834, chap. 104, reported the same without amendment;

Which was read.

The said bill was then read the second time, by special order, passed, and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Matthias reported a bill entitled, an act to ircorporate the Trustees of Benjamin's Church, in Carroll county;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
