Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

On motion of Mr. Bruce,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Perry, entitled, an act supplemental to an act to incorporate the Cumberland Hotel, in Cumberland.

The amendments reported to said bill from the committee on corporations

Were read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Bruce,

The third amendment reported by said committee was amended, by inserting after the word 'and,' in the last line thereof, the following,—'the sum of twelve thousand five hundred dollars;'

The said amendments were then assented to, as amended.

On motion of Mr. Buchanan,

Said bill was amended, by adding at the end thereof the following proviso—'and provided that said President and Directors shall be held and firmly bound in their private capacities for all debts created by said company.'

On motion of Mr. McLean,

Said bill was further amended, by adding at the end thereof the following—in case those debts should at any time exceed the sum actually paid in, and that any director who was absent at the time of creating such excess may exonerate himself from any such liability by representing the same to the Governor of Maryland, or a meeting of the Stockholders, which he shall have the power to call for that purpose—provided that nothing in this act shall be construed to exonerate the capital stock, or any of the assets of said company, from any debts created by any board of directors;'
