Were sent to the senate.

Mr. Ridgely presented a petition of Mary Smith, of Anne Arundel county, widow of Acquilla Smith, a soldier of the revolution, praying to be placed on the pension roll,

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Iglehart presented a petition of Rachel M. Gaither, praying the passage of a law authorising her to manumit and set free a certain negro therein mentioned, in this State,

Which was read and referred to the committee on colored population.

Mr. Brengle presented a petition of sundry citizens of Carroll county, praying that the marriage between John Ecker and Hannah Myers, may not be made valid,

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Alexander presented a petition of James Thompson, praying for additional compensation for work done on the public circle,

Which was read and referred to the committee on claims.

Mr. Pearson presented a petition of sundry citizens of Cecil county, praying the passage of an act to authorise the building of a bridge over North East creek, near Harford's mill,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Pearson, Taylor, and Henderson.

Mr. Pearson also presented a petition of sundry citizens of the village of Port Deposit, in Cecil county, praying the passage of an act to authorise the appointment of an additional Lumber Inspector, and to regulate the number of deputies,
