authorised and required to pay B. S. Pigman, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, the sum of two hundred dollars, as a remuneration for his services as one of the council to assist the Attorney General in commencing and prosecuting a suit in the Supreme Court of the United States, in the name of the State of Maryland as complainant, against the State of Virginia as defendant.
