Which was read and referred to Messrs. Ely, Worthington and Risteau.

Mr. Richardson presented a memorial of numerous citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying for the repeal of the monopoly act in favor of the Medical Faculty,

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

Mr. Richardson also presented a memorial of numerous citizens of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act to regulate corporations,

Which was read and referred to the committee on corporations.

Mr. Laveille presented a petition from the trustees of Battle Breek Academy, in Calvert county, praying for a donation from the State;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Risteau presented a report of the Trustees of St. James' Academy, in Baltimore county, relative to the condition of said Academy,

Which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Harrison presented a petition of sundry citizens of Kent Island, in Queen Anne's county, praying for the passage of a law for the more effectual protection of oysters in the waters of said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Hemsley and Palmer;

And Mr. Richardson presented a petition of Nathaniel Burke, of the city of Baltimore, a soldier of the revolution, praying the State to grant him the bounty land to which he is entitled by the terms of his enlistment,

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Richardson obtained leave to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act concerning crimes and punishments, passed at November session 1809, chapter 136;
