Ordered, That the committee on grievances and courts of justice enquire into the expediency of appointing in each judicial district, a person of intelligence and sound legal knowledge, to be styled the "judge of probate" for said respective districts; the said judge of probate to have and exercise all the powers, and to perform all the duties of the justices of the orphans courts in the several counties of this State. Said judges of probate to be appointed and commissioned in the same manner, and to hold their offices by the like tenure as the judges of the several courts of law in this State.
