The bill reported by Mr. Alexander, chairman of the committee on ways and means, entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, an act to incorporate the Real Estate Bank of Baltimore,

Was taken up for consideration, read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Henderson, entitled, an act to authorise Samuel McBride, to bring into this State a slave for a term of years, and the amendment reported thereto, from the committee on colored population, were taken up for consideration,

The amendment having been read the second time, was assented to.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Comegys, entitled, an act to authorise Hyland B. Pennington, of Baltimore city, to bring into this State a slave for a term of years, and the amendment reported thereto from the committee on colored population, was taken up for consideration.

The amendment having been read the second time, was assented to.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Matthias, entitled, an act to incorporate the Trustees of Benjamin's Church, in Carroll county, was taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. McLean, said bill was referred to the committee on corporations.

On motion of Mr. Harris, the unfavorable report of the committee on the colored population, upon the bill reported by him, entitled, an act to authorise William B. Scott, of St. Mary's county, to bring into this State certain negroes therein named,

Was taken up for consideration, and read the second time;

On the question being put, on concurring in the report of the committee, recommending the rejection of said bill,

It was determined in the negative.
