Mr. Usilton, from the committee to whom was recommit- ted the bill entitled, an act to abolish the board of commis- sioner of tax in Kent county, and to vest their powers and duties in the levy court of said county, reported unfavora- bly thereon;

Which was read the first, and by special order the se- cond time, and concurred in.

Mr. Alexander gave notice that on Monday next, he should move to amend the 42d rule of the house, by add- ing thereto the following—

And if any bill, resolution, or other motion, shall be laid on the table, the same shall be taken up in turn on the se- venth day thereafter, and immediately after the bills and resolutions entitled to a second reading shall have been disposed of; but this rule shall not prevent the house from taking up such motion at an earlier day, or from again direc- ting it to be laid on the table.

Which was read.

Mr. Boyd, chairmau of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favorable report upon the pe- tition of Valentine Brunner, a soldier of the revolution, ac- companied with the following resolution—

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby, authorised and directed to pay to Valentine Brunner, or or- der, out of any unappropriated money in the Treasury, the half pay of a private during his life, as a further remun- eration for his services during the revolutionary war.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to.

Mr. Usilton obtained leave to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and for other purposes, passed December session 1827;

Ordered, That Messrs. Usilton, Crisfield and Kershner report the same.

Mr. Tuck, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, reported a bill entitled, an act to determine the time from which acts of the General Assembly of Mary- land shall have operation.
