Mr. Shower presented a petition of the Manchester Academy, in Carroll county, praying for a donation from the State;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Culbreth presented a petition of James Frazier, of the city of Annapolis, praying to be paid the amount of pension due his uncle, Samuel Frazier, a revolutionary soldier, at the time of his death.

Which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. McLean presented a petition of Sarah Richards, of the city of Baltimore, praying to be divorced from her husband Isaiah Richards; and,

Mr. McDaniel presented a petition of Eliza Ann Boyd, of Kent county, praying to be divorced from her husband, James Boyd;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on divorces.

Mr. McDaniel also presented a petition of Biner Cook, a free woman of colour, praying the passage of an act to authorise her to remain within this State;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on coloured population.

Mr. Kerr presented a petition of Philemon Willis, of Talbot county, praying to have refunded a certain sum of money heretofore paid by him into the treasury;

Which was read, and referred to the committee on claims.

Mr. Maulsby presented a petition of Carvil H. Prigg, of Harford county, praying to be released from the recognizance therein named;
