Mr. Iglehart, submitted the following resolution,

By the House of Delegates,

December 30th, 1836.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to the Electors of President and V. President of the U. States, for the year 1836, their secretary and officers, or to their orders, to the Electors of the Senate for the year 1836, their clerk and officers, or to their orders, and to such of the members of the late and present Senate who attended at the seat of Government, in obedience to the Proclamation of the Governor, in November last, their clerks and officers, or to their orders, the several sums of money due to them, and for which they may obtain certificates from the chairman of the committee on Claims of the present House of Delegates.

Which was read the first, and by a special order the sec nd time, assented to, and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Rentch, reported a bill, entitled, an act to in orate the Williamsport Manufacturing Company;

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Simmons,

Ordered, That so much of the Governor, s message as relates to the Inspections, be referred to the standing committee on that subject.

The Clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled, an act, to authorise the treasurer for the Western Shore, to receive such sum or sums of money, as shall be awarded to the State of Maryland, under the provisions of the act of Congress therein mentioned,—endorsed, "will pass," ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the resolution in favour of the Electors of President and Vice President of the United States, and Electors of Senate and officers, endorsed "assented to," and ordered to be engrossed;—and delivered a communication from the Treasurer of the Western Shore, endorsed "referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates," and is as follows.
