Which was read, and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Parran moved that the house proceed to ballot for a Senator to represent this State in the Senate of the United States, to supply the vacancy occasioned by the death of the honorable Robert H. Goidsborcugh.

Resolved in the affirmative;

On motion of Mr. Eccleston, the house was called, and the door keeper sent for the absent members; who after a short time had elapsed, returned and reported that he had notified the absent members that their attendance was required.

The house then proceeded to ballot for a Senator to represent this State in the Senate of the United States until the 4th day of March next. The ballot box being prepared, the ballots were deposited therein, sealed up, and delivered to the committee of the House of Delegates, appointed to meet the committee of the Senate, to count the joint ballot, who retired to the conference room, and after some time returned and reported that there were seventy-nine votes taken, of which number Doct. John S. Spence received sixty-three votes, and there were five scattering and eleven blank ballots.

Whereupon resolved, That Doctor John S. Spence be, and he is hereby declared to be, a Senator to represent this State in the Senate of the United States until the 4th day of March next.
