A bill, entitled, a further supplement to the act, to Incorporate the George's Creek Mining Company,

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to

lie on t e table.

Mr. Richardson reported a bill, entitled, an act to Incorporate the Friendship Beneficial Society of the city of Baltimore;

Which was read the first time, -and,

On motion of Mr. Richardson, referred to the commit-

tee on corporations.

On motion of Mr. Boyd, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled, an act to enable William Wilson, of William, of Harford county, to manumit and set free the negro man therein mentioned;

On motion of Mr. Eccleston said bill was referred to the

committee on the coloured population.

The hour of twelve having arrived, the house proceeded to the election of a Governor, in conformity with arrangements made with the Senate, for that purpose, and the ballots of the members being collected in the ballot box, it was sealed up and delivered to the committee appointed on the part of the House, to meet the committee appointed on the part of the Senate, to count the joint ballot of both Houses, and report the result.

They having retired to the conference room, after a short time, returned and reported, that on counting the joint ballot of both houses, they had found there were altogether eighty one votes taken, of which number Thomas W. Veazey, Esq. received seventy votes, two scatternig, and nine blank bal-

lots.

Whereupon it was Resolved, that Thomas W. Veazey, Esqr., be and he is hereby declared to be duly elected Governor of the State of Maryland for the ensuing year.

Mr. Hemsley submitted the following message, which was read and assented to:

By the House of Delegates January 2d, 1837.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

His Excellency Thomas W. Veazey of Cecil county, having been re-elected Governor of this State, we propose with your concurrence the appointment of a joint committee of the two Houses, to wait on him, and inform him of his re-election, and request his attendance in the Senate chamber to qualify according to the Constitution and form of Government of this State; we have appointed Messrs. Hemsley
