

A report from the clerk of Kent county, exhibiting the aggregate valuation, rate of tax, and general charge of expenditures in Kent county, severally endorsed "referred to the consideration of the House of Delegates;"

Which were read and severally referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Keene submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and sent to the Senate;

By the House of Delegates,  
January 4th, 1837.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

We have received your message proposing that a joint letter be written by the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Delegates, and forwarded by mail to each member of the Council elect to the Governor of this State, notifying them of their election, and requesting their immediate attendance at the Seat of Government to qualify according to the constitution and laws of this State, and concur therein.

Mr. Mann, obtained leave to bring in a bill, requiring the Commissioners of Washington county, to levy at their next levy, a sufficient sum of money in advance, to pay jurors and state witnesses in said county,

Ordered, that Messrs. Mann, Rentch and Kershner, report the same.

Mr. Matthias, obtained leave to bring in a bill, entitled, an act to change the name of Ann Iselt, of Frederick county,

Ordered, that Messrs. Matthias, Brengle and Doub, report the same.

On motion of Mr. Duke,

Ordered, that the committee on ways and means, enquire into the expediency of appropriating the money to be received from the General Government into a State or Real Estate Bank, for the benefit of the landed interest of this State, and report by bill or otherwise.

On motion of Mr. Brengle,

Ordered, that a petition and memorial of sundry citizens of parts of Frederick and Baltimore counties, asking the erection of "Carroll county," and which was taken from the files of this house at the last session, by leave thereof, be returned and placed on the files of this house.

On motion of Mr. Townsend, of Talbot,
