FOUR O'CLOCK, P. M

The house met.

Mr. Primrose presented three memorials, signed by William Copper, James B. Parrish and Thomas H. Osborn and others, citizens of Kent county, severally praying that the law passed at December session 1835, establishing magistrates courts in the several counties of this State, may not be repealed so far as the same relates to the aforesaid county;

Which were read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. Primrose also presented a petition of Thomas B. Hynson and others, of Kent county, praying a special act relating to the commissioners and levy court of said county;

Which was read and referred to the committee on grievances and courts of justice; and

Mr. Kershner presented a petition of Mary W. Burdeau of Washington county, praying to be divorced from her husband Charles Burdeau;

Which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

The bill reported by Mr. Kershner entitled, a further additional supplement to the act entitled, an act for the founding an academy at Hagerstown, in Washington county; and

The bill reported by Mr. Handy entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the relief and support of the poor and indigent persons in Worcester county, passed at December session 1835, ch. 219;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

Mr. Handy (seconded by two other members that voted in the majority) moved to reconsider the vote of the house upon the bill rejected by the house on yesterday, entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Godfrey of Baltimore county, from her husband Henry Godfrey;

Resolved in the affirmative.
