

On motion of Mr. Ely, said bill was then laid on the table.

The bill reported by Mr. Iglehart entitled, an act to authorise the commissioners of Anne Arundel county to levy a sum of money for the payment of a clerk to the commissioners of primary schools;

Also the bill reported by him entitled, an act for the benefit of Charles Boone, late collector of the second collection district in Anne Arundel county;

Also the bill reported by Mr. Worthington, entitled, an act relating to the election districts in Baltimore county;

And the bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of James B. Wager, an insolvent debtor;

Were severally taken up for consideration, read the second time and passed.

On motion of Mr. Worthington, the house took up for consideration the bill reported by Mr. Richardson, entitled, an act relating to coroners in the city and county of Baltimore.

On motion of Mr. Worthington, said bill was amended by striking out from the word 'nature,' in the 5th line, 1st section, to the end of said section.

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Primrose, the house took up for consideration the bill from the Senate, entitled an act to abolish the board of commissioners of tax in Kent county, and vest their powers and duties in the levy court of said county.

Mr. Usilton moved to recommit the bill;

Resolved in the affirmative.

The bill from the Senate, entitled, an act for the relief of Edward Hines, late of Kent county, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Culbreth, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, entitled, an act to make valid the marriage of John Ecker and Hannah Myers or Ecker, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Hemsley, from the committee on coloured population, entitled, an act to authorise William Powell, of Talbot county, to bring into this State certain slaves for a term of years, was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Gough moved to lay said bill on the table;
