Mr. Kershner reported a bill, entitled, on act relating to the German Reformed Parsonage, in the town of Hagerstown, Washington county;

And, Mr. Carpenter, reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act, entitled, an act to incorporate a company under the name of the Hydrant company of Port Tobacco,

Which were severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.
